

**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT
BETWEEN
ARMY MANAGEMENT STAFF COLLEGE
AND
DEVRY UNIVERSITY, INC.**

This memorandum of agreement establishes an articulation agreement between the United States Army Management Staff College and DeVry University, Inc. This arrangement provides an opportunity for graduates of the Civilian Education System (CES) who are matriculated students of DeVry University to receive transfer credits applied to DeVry University's Bachelor of Science in Business Administration (BSBA), Bachelor of Science in Technical Management (BSTM), Bachelor of Science in Management (BSM), Master of Public Administration (MPA) or Master of Business Administration (MBA). Students are required to complete any of the following CES courses in order to receive transfer credit: Basic Course; Intermediate Course; or Advanced Course. This agreement is effective with the January 2007 CES class.

CES students or graduates participating in this program are eligible to receive course-to-course transfers in the DeVry University degree program specified below, and can enroll either in residence or online classes.

The purpose of this memorandum of agreement is to describe the Army Management Staff College/DeVry University articulation agreement, student eligibility, academic credits awarded, admissions, publicity and changes to this agreement.

DeVry University Transfer Credit Awarded

Qualified students enrolled in the CES program may apply for course-to-course transfer for DeVry University credit as shown in the following chart:

Transfer credit is awarded to DeVry University students who have completed the Civilian Education System any of the Basic Course, Intermediate Course or Advanced Course at the Army Management Staff College. CES graduates must submit an official copy of their diploma issued by the AMSC registrar reflecting successful completion of any of the Basic Course, Intermediate Course or Advanced Course.

Admission to DeVry University

Requirements for admission to the CES/DeVry Cooperative Masters Degree Program are as follows:

- ◆ This agreement between the U. S. Army Management Staff College and DeVry University applies to students successfully completing the CES programs. This requirement includes completion of any of the Basic Course, Intermediate Course or Advanced Course in residence at the Army Management Staff College. All participants in the program must submit an official diploma from the Army Management Staff College that reflects completion of the CES curriculum.
- ◆ Undergraduate students admitted to DeVry University will be required to meet the same minimum admissions requirements as all other of DeVry's U.S.-based undergraduate students.
- ◆ Graduate students admitted to DeVry University's Keller Graduate School of Management will be required to meet the same minimum admissions requirements as all other U.S.-based DeVry/Keller graduate students.
- ◆ Participants in this program are not required to complete separate graduate entrance examinations such as Graduate Record Exam (GRE), Graduate Management Admission Test (GMAT), or Miller's Analogy Test (MAT). Letters of recommendation will not be required.
- ◆ All students should consult the academic policies and procedures section of the current DeVry University Graduate/Undergraduate Studies Catalog concerning admission, enrollment and academic policies.

Note: This agreement between the Army Management Staff College and DeVry University will apply to graduates who entered the program in January 2007, beginning with the 02-08 class.

Under the terms of this MOA, AMSC and DeVry University agree

to:

- ◆ Publicize the CES/DeVry partnership and corresponding education and training opportunities in a manner approved in advance by both parties. In no case, will any such materials be published in a manner that would constitute an expressed or implied endorsement by the Department of Defense.
- ◆ Provide website links between AMSC/CES and DeVry University websites, as approved in advance by both parties.
- ◆ Notify DeVry University in a timely manner of upcoming changes to the CES curriculum or requirements.
- ◆ AMSC and DeVry may use the other party's name or logo in published materials (e.g., website and catalog) to reference this agreement. The content and text of such published

materials must be approved by each party prior to release. Any logo owned by AMSC will not be altered or used in a manner inconsistent with its intended use.

Point of Contact

The point of contact at DeVry University for questions on any aspect of this articulation agreement between the AMSC and DeVry is Dr. David Overbye, Dean of Academic Outreach.

Termination of Agreement

This memorandum of agreement will be effective upon execution by the below participants to the agreement, and will continue until written notice of cancellation is received a minimum of 90 days before such cancellation. Changes to the CES program or its curriculum will subject this Memorandum of Agreement to additional review and possible renegotiation. An appropriate liaison from each institution will be designated to coordinate all aspects of this agreement and any future joint projects.




