G-3/7 Civilian Training and Leader Development GoArmyEd —Army Civilian Integration

- ♦ *September 2013: Schools With GoArmyEd Accounts Prompted to Activate Additional G-3/5/7 User Rights.*

GoArmyEd Expanding to Army Civilians—Fall 2013!

Coming September 2013, Army Civilians will join 400,000 Active, Guard, and Reserve Duty Soldiers who already use GoArmyEd to process Army Civilian training applications and registration requests for all G-3/5/7 centrally funded and Command-funded training and professional development classes that start on or after 1 October 2013. Integration of Army Civilians into GoArmyEd will make GoArmyEd Army's single enterprise system for managing education benefits for all Army personnel worldwide – anytime, anywhere.



Army Civilians Will Use GoArmyEd To:

- Submit streamlined and standardized electronic training applications
- Submit online SF 182 course registration requests for Supervisor, Training Manager or Career Program Manager approvals
- Manage course drops and withdrawals online, including operational withdrawal requests
- Access electronic Student Record with military and civilian education histories, including official grades
- Access toll-free 5-day/12-hour helpdesk and online case creation for both navigational and professional development advice and support
- Receive automated email confirmations and alerts

- ♦ *GoArmyEd coordinates the activities of a 5/12 toll-free helpdesk, Army Civilian Supervisors, Career Program Managers, Training Managers, schools and vendors, and HQDA.*
- ♦ *G-3/5/7 program leaders assist Army Civilians in planning, registering for, and tracking progress against their professional development goals.*

Simplify, Streamline, and Automate with GoArmyEd.

Approximately 3,000 schools and vendors currently have GoArmyEd accounts to manage class enrollment requests, submit grades, submit invoices, and receive payment for Army Tuition Assistance-funded classes. Beginning October 2013, schools that already have accounts in GoArmyEd will use GoArmyEd to perform the same functions for Army-funded Civilian course registrations. Schools and vendors that don't have accounts will work with the Army to create them.
